

## Study Guide for Romans 9:6-14

### Passages to Read

Romans 9

Genesis 15:1-6; 16:1-4,15; 17:15-21; 18:9-14; 21:12; 25:19-24

Galatians 3:28; 4:22-28; Romans 8:28; Ephesians 1:11, 3:11; 2 Timothy 1:9

What is the main question that Paul is answering in this section of Romans 9-11?

Why is this theologically significant for us today as New Covenant believers?

To whom is Paul referring to by the second term "Israel" in verse 6?

In this passage, does Paul transfer the term Israel to the church?

In Romans 9 is Paul speaking of corporate/national or personal salvation?

How does Paul's use of the Old Testament scriptures in verses 7 and 9 support his argument that "they are not all Israel who descended from Israel" ?

How does Paul's example of Rebekah and the twins strengthen his argument?

What is the purpose of God in all of this?

What is contrasted in verse 11 and what is the theological significance of this?
